Camilla Brattland is visiting the CURRA from the Sámi fisheries research network Fávllis at the University of Tromsø in Norway. In this presentation, she will draw on examples from the Coastal Resource Inventory in Newfoundland and Marine Habitat Mapping efforts in Norway. Ms. Brattland will review and compare how, in these two different initiatives, fishermen's knowledge is collected and transformed by science, and then applied and made publically available by management. She will also address theoretical and methodological issues encountered when fishermen's knowledge is integrated and transformed by science and to what degree and under which circumstances its successful integration and application is made possible.
